### ROBERT J. HYE BEST TRAINEE COMPETITION

Dr. Bob Hye was an outstanding vascular surgeon committed to excellence in research by being the San Diego Area Research Chair for SCPMG. His academic interests included carotid and peripheral arterial disease. Bob published over 100 articles and book chapters and was the Principal Investigator in 40 clinical research trials to better the field of vascular surgery. He was also responsible for founding registries to track abdominal aortic aneurysms within the Kaiser Permanente System. As a physician, educator, researcher, and scholar Bob's life is a testament to vascular surgery – the surgical specialty he cultivated and helped flourish at UCSD and in the Southern California region. His counsel, enthusiasm for vascular surgery, commitment to resident education, and leadership was especially significant.

He took advantage of every day and never complained about his illness, referring to it as only "bad luck". He was pragmatic, sharp and funny. He passed on February 22, 2016. He is deeply missed by everyone whose life was touched by his. Cash prizes will be awarded to the top three papers presented by residents at the meeting to honor loyal past member Dr. Robert J. Hye.



### Dr. Dennis Baker Invited Guest Lecturer John Francis Eidt, MD

John Eidt, MD, RVT, RPVI, FACS, earned his medical degree at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, Texas. He then completed an internship and a residency in general surgery at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston, MA. He returned to UT Southwestern for fellowship training in vascular surgery.





Since 2015, he has been vice chair of vascular surgery at Baylor Scott & White Heart and Vascular Hospital - Dallas. Dr. Eidt is a Distinguished Fellow of the Society for Vascular Surgery, is co-editor of Scientific American Vascular and Endovascular Surgery, and serves on the editorial board of Vascular Specialist, the official publication of the Society for Vascular Surgery.





Past President Dr. J. Dennis Baker, MD, Professor Emeritus of Surgery passed on January 26, 2021 due to heart failure. Dr. Baker was a gifted surgeon, educator, mentor, administrator, and dedicated researcher in vascular physiologic testing and imaging.

He was devoted to his patients and trainees and was a beloved UCLA faculty member and doctor at the Veterans Administration. He served the VA for over 46 years as a surgeon, chief of vascular and in several administrative positions.

To honor his contributions to the vascular community members voted to tribute a guest lecture in his name. In 2021 Dr. Teruya chose Dr. Farber to be the inaugural Dr. J. Dennis Baker Presidential Guest Lecturer.

### Invited Guest Lecturer Dr. Elizabeth Ann Bromley

Elizabeth Bromley is a psychiatrist and medical anthropologist. She is Associate Professor in Residence in the Departments of Psychiatry and Biobehavioral Sciences and Anthropology at UCLA. She is the Director of the UCLA-DMH Public Mental Health Partnership which provides training and implementation support to public mental health clinic teams that serve individuals with severe mental illness.

Between 2004 and 2018, Dr. Bromley was Medical Director for the Greater Los Angeles VA Mental Health Intensive Case Management (MHICM) program. Her research has focused on the beliefs and concepts that underlie caregiving practices and the extent to which they match therapeutic action to patient experience. Dr. Bromley also has a research interest in physician identity and physician emotional experience, particularly as they pertain to the problem of suicide among physicians.
